Grunberg please refer to attached typed statement which is my account of the activities of 10/17/10 I have reviewed it and is correct to the best of my recollection. I would like to add that when I arrived I performed a quick assessment/triage + determined that P.O. Hess was a viable pt. whereas the supine black male was a priority 0 (zero). Also I recall that when I was responding to P.O. Castagna, P.O.

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Gilmartin stopped me & said (and showed me) that he had blood on his fingers from "the deceased" and asked if I could take care of it for him. I told him I would be right back, but proceeded to go in Nov 3 to WMC w/ P.O. Castagna & did not have any more contact with P.O. Gilmartin.

I had also noted when tending to P.O. Castagna, there was large pieces of glass on the sidewalk.

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On Sunday, October 17, 2010 at approximately 01:30, Pleasantville Ambulance was paged for a large fight at Finnegan's. I responded with my husband, Greg Wind, NYS EMT #234423, in our "Fly Car" 7606. When I arrived at the scene, I can only describe it as "chaotic" and "riot-like". I got out of my vehicle and saw P.O. Aaron Hess lying on the ground. A female, approximately early 20's, blonde and wearing a white sweater dress was with him. When I approached P.O. Hess, she said something to him, and walked away. I asked P.O. Hess what happened and he responded that he was "run over" and that his knee was "messed up".

I looked over and witnessed a male black lying supine on the ground approximately 10' to 15' away. I could see some blood on his face, and I observed that he was not moving. Greg Wind went over to him and felt for a carotid pulse and felt none. The girl in the white dress then went over and was performing CPR. I advised Greg Wind that he needed to go and get another ambulance, which he did, leaving in 7606.

Paramedic Beth Sanger then arrived on scene. She came to me and I advised her that I was taking care of Aaron. I told her that I thought the male lying on the ground was dead. She went over to him, assessed him, and told me that she had to work him. I told her that was fine and that I would stay with P.O. Hess. As soon as the first ambulance arrived on scene (7601), I directed them to go to the patient that Paramedic Sanger was working on and that CPR was in progress. I told them what equipment that they needed and they went to that patient and performed under Paramedic Sanger's direction. Once the ambulance crew arrived, the girl in the white dress came back over to P.O. Hess and removed a piece of white clothing, possibly a jacket, that she had put underneath him. At one point, two male whites began taunting P.O. Hess, and I summoned a Police Officer to please remove them.

The second ambulance arrived (7603) and I directed that crew that they were going to be transporting P.O. Hess. They lifted him on to the stretcher and transported him to WMC.

Our third ambulance (7602) arrived on scene. They were directed by P.O.s on the scene to treat the male with the arm wound. Patient was treated and transported to WMC.


I remained on scene until we were advised that there was another Officer injured. I asked P.O. Gilmartin where the injured P.O. was. He directed me and EMT Tyler Colangelo and CFR Nick D'Adessio to where P.O. Carl Castanga was. P.O. Castanga was already collared and boarded by Yonkers ESU (I believe). When ambulance 7603 returned to the scene from WMC, P.O. Castanga was lifted to the stretcher and transported to WMC. I accompanied the ambulance (rode in the front) to the hospital so that I would not be left at the scene. EMT Colangelo and CFR D'Adessio drove Paramedic Steve Petrellese's vehicle to the ER.
