Subject: cell phone of driver from Finnegan's incident

Brian and Bob,

Yesterday, when the County Crime Scene Unit was securing our police cars, they turned over the long guns from each vehicle and gave me what they thought was Ron Beckley's personal cell phone. They located it on the passenger seat of 42. I delivered the phone to Ron at home and discovered that the phone was not his. He mentioned that the phone could belong to the suspect in this incident. I contacted Justin by cell phone to see if the phone was his. He reported that the phone was laying on the ground next to the suspect and that he secured it by tossing it onto the seat of what he thought was his RMP. I called Artie last night to advise him, as I thought this could be an important piece of evidence. I did a pcr on it and secured it in evidence locker #2. I was going to update the case, but saw that there was nothing in the case narrative and did not want to start the case narrative off by documenting those events. I understand you are busy this morning. I had left Artie a message last night around 8pm and then tried to call him this morning at 0830. I tried to call Bob also, I know that you guys are very busy and just wanted you to be aware. After I cleared the crime scene last night, I went to see Carl. He is shaken up, but told me he will be in today. I told him that we needed his clothing. He advised that it was still in the hospital bag he was released with. He will bring them in. He also said that his right hip was starting to bruise and I think that taking a picture of that bruising would be a good idea. Please let me know if you guys need help with anything. I will be available today if needed.
