I, Brian Sanger Aged 41 years, give this true and voluntary statement to Detective Greenberg regarding the events of October 17th, 2010. On Sunday October 17th, 2010 at 0126hrs I was sitting in my ³⁷¹¹ vehicle at the Mt. Pleasant police department when I was dispatched to a police officer down in front of Finnegan's. En route to the call location I was listening to the police frequency and about half way to the call I heard a transmission of shots fired. at 0130hrs when pulling on location I inquired if the scene was secure for my entry and heard no response. I parked my vehicle on the West side of CVS and remained at the back drivers side bumper and did a scene size up. I viewed several police vehicles with their lights on, the PWC 7106 parked in front of CVS, a group of 5-6 kids on the South side of the driveway (sidewalk) with cell phones out, a group of loud somewhat unruly kids being held back by at least one police officer on the store front sidewalk, another group of loud kids on the South.

I have read or had read to me the above statement consisting of 6 page(s) and understand it, and it is true. This statement was completed at (time) 1522 am/pm, on the 25 day of OCTOBER, 2010.

officer Hess on the ground near 7606. At that time I deemed the
scene secure enough for me to enter. I grabbed my gear and approached
Gail and officer Hess asking Gail how many total patients we had and
determined Police officer Hess' injuries were not life threatening. Gail told
me there were two patients to her knowledge pointing to a patient on
the ground stating he is dead and officer Hess had an isolated leg injury
has talking a total of approximately 10-15 seconds at which I heard an
AED stating NO shock indicated and to continue CPR. I immediately

then approached me to offer assistance the female in the cream sweater

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A nurse, she said she was a biology student or in the biology dept. I told her thank you but no, at that point she got up and walked away as the PRAC ambulance crew approached me from behind. ~~the~~ ^{the} I went to cut off the patients jacket noticed he was handcuffed, requested officer Gilmer to remove them and he uncuffed one hand and left the cuffs on the other hand. the patient was placed on a stretcher and on the stretcher and in the ambulance. As I was stepping in the side door of the ambulance, which was directly next to fail and officer Hess, I advised fail that officer Hess was to be the next person off this scene. ~~after~~ ^{after} in the back of the ambulance CPR was continued and had been continuous. I instructed the driver to move the ambulance off the scene and stop, as ~~if~~ ^{the} the ambulance was being moved the patients airway was suctioned - removing blood - once the ambulance was stopped the patient was intubated and my trauma bag retrieved from my vehicle, the

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patient received a full assessment en route to the ER, with IV established and medications administered and continuous CPR. I requested the ambulance to pull off scene and stop so the ambulance was out of any potential harm while ALS interventions and assessments took place. Ambulance arrived at WMC with a full report given to the ER staff. During the course of treatment the clothing, which I remember as a dark colored sweatshirt type material was cut off the patient and was underneath him when transferred to ER staff. Once patient was transferred to ER I restocked my equipment. I radioed my dispatch to determine if I was needed or another medic was needed back at the scene also advising dispatch that the transcare supervisor was at WMC available if needed. Dispatch advised me to have the supervisor/medic respond for another potential patient at that location. Supervisor responded. About 45 minutes later I was

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Called back by Pleasantville Ambulance to the scene, unknown
at that time why, once back on the scene I was asked by both
Pleasantville ambulance member Greg Wind and a Westchester County
police officer if I was able to remove barbs from a person who had
been tarred. I advised them I was not allowed to remove barbs as they
are considered impaled objects and either the police dept had to remove
them or the person had to go to the ER, the police officer asked again
if I could remove them I and stated "no". the police officer took
a tall, well built, young black male from the back of his vehicle to
show me the barb in his abdominal area I told the police officer
he could either place the person in the back of the ambulance for
transport or he could transport himself. At that point there were multiple
police vehicles from different agencies, the scene was fairly under control
with no apparent large crowds in sight. After the police officer left with
